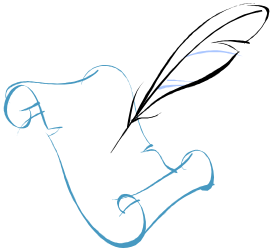

Awards

All garden clubs are encouraged to apply for an award for recognition of work that has been completed in Laurel District. Requirements for each award can be found in the Awards Section in the GUIDE, starting on page 205. Some important things to know: Source for awards application forms: www.uga.edu/gardenclub At the bottom of the GCG Home Page, click on Awards Program; The Awards Program Page offers award applications for GCG, DSR and NGC. The Awards Committee prefers the applications to be typed. When the GCG and DSR applications are pulled up on the GCG web site, members are encouraged to type in required information while on line. In printing the completed form, remember to print the correct number of forms needed, because completed applications can not be saved. Visit the NGC web site: www.gardenclub.org for further help. Click on Awards/Scholarship; for: NGC award application, NGC awards information, Book of Evidence guide, flower show achievement awards checklist, yearbook ideas, etc. Read the Sept./Oct. issue of The National Gardener for NGC Award rules. It is important that the bottom section of the awards application is not overlooked. Study this for information on: yearbooks, award rules, flower show awards, the number of application forms required and where entries are to be sent. Be sure to send the entry and application to the correct person/s. When applying for a state award that corresponds to a DSR or NGC Award, study the DSR and NGC requirements for the same award. Compile the Book of Evidence to fulfill requirements for State, District and National, when applicable. By including requirements other than GCG's requirements, it insures that a state winning Book of Evidence will score higher when judged by the DSR or NGC scales of points. If a garden club or garden club member feels that an application is worthy of a state award, and possibly a district or a national award, make a copy of the book of evidence and send along with the original. The copy can be in either color or black and white. The appropriate awards application forms should also accompany the second book. (In past years, the GA Awards Committee has personally paid to make copies of entries going on to further competition). Always make and keep a copy of each Book of Evidence.

GDOT WILDFLOWER WORKSHOP

IMPORTANCE OF THIS WORKSHOP:

Garden Club Ladies:

By now you have received the information and registration form for the Roadside Beautification GDOT workshop from Z. Ganaway, GCG Roadside Chairman, South, adazle@yahoo.com Please act on this immediately.

The Department of Transportation Roadside Beautification Program of planting along the highways with native flowers' is far from reaching its potential. In fact, it is moving very slowly.

Garden Club is Georgia is a formidable force in being able to get things done. We need your help in attending the workshop on September 13 so that we can show the GDOT people just how serious we are about having our highways planted in beautiful flowers.

GDOT has plenty of money available. The sales of the wildflower tags generates more than \$22 profit from each one that goes directly into the wildflower kitty' with Department of Transportation. State law designates that legislators nor the governor can get their hands on this money and use it for other purposes.

We have won with billboards; we have won on environmental issues; now let us win on Roadside Beautification. Many people write to me—even people who have no connection to Garden Club and ask how they can get wildflowers planted in their counties. WE NEED TO MAKE THAT POSSIBLE.

Each county has a State Department of Transportation foreman who has a state crew, separate from the County Department of Transportation, AND MONEY IS AVAILABLE TO THEM FOR PLANTING.

GCG must put the pressure on the higher ups in GDOT to see that their county foremen participate in planting wildflowers. Most of them don't want to be bothered, and what they do plant grows up in weeds higher than your head.

DISTRICT DIRECTORS; PLEASE E-MAIL THIS LETTER TO EVERY CLUB PRESIDENT IN YOUR DISTRICT, ALONG WITH A COPY OF THE REGISTRATION FORM YOU HAVE ALREADY RECEIVED. (WITH COPY BACK TO ME SO I KNOW WHO IS GETTING IT, PLEASE, FOR FAVOR!).

WE NEED 75 Garden Club of Georgia members to be present in Griffin on September 13. The cost for the day is only \$30 per person; the program starts at 10 a.m. and is over at 2 p.m., so you have time to get there and return home in one day.

Please wear your brightest colors so you will look like bright roadside wildflowers, guaranteed to be seen from a distance as we all sit together. We want to make an impression with our vast numbers on that day!!! Numbers count, so that we can move forward with pressing the GDOT officials to vamp up their acreage of wildflowers. Three or four women showing up is not an impression.
